Protein Background:

Core component of nucleosome. Nucleosomes wrap and compact DNA into chromatin, limiting DNA accessibility to the cellular machineries which require DNA as a template. Histones thereby play a central role in transcription regulation, DNA repair, DNA replication and chromosomal stability. DNA accessibility is regulated via a complex set of post-translational modifications of histones, also called histone code, and nucleosome remodeling.

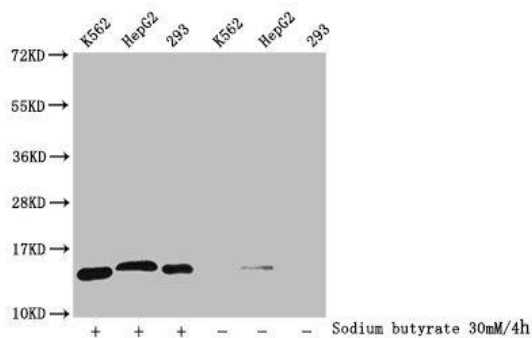

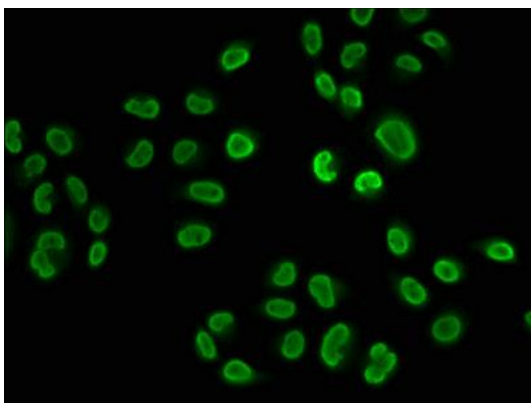

Western Blot. Detected samples: K562 whole cell lysate, HepG2 whole cell lysate, 293 whole cell lysate; Untreated (-) or treated (+) with 30mM sodium butyrate for 4h. All lanes: HIST1H2BC antibody at 1:300. Secondary. Goat polyclonal to rabbit IgG at 1/50000 dilution. Predicted band size: 14 kDa. Observed band size: 14 kDa.



Immunofluorescence staining of HeLa cells (treated with 30mM sodium butyrate for 4h) with PACO59654 at 1:15, counter-stained with DAPI. The cells were fixed in 4% formaldehyde, permeabilized using 0.2% Triton X-100 and blocked in 10% normal Goat Serum. The cells were then incubated with the antibody overnight at 4°C. The secondary antibody was Alexa Fluor 488-conjugated AffiniPure Goat Anti-Rabbit IgG(H+L).
