Storage: Store at -20°C. Avoid freeze / thaw cycles. Buffer: PBS containing 50% glycerol and 0.05% BSA, preserved with proclin300 or sodium azide (as specified on the Certificate of Analysis), pH 7.3.

Store Bradford Reagent at Room Temperature for 1 Year.

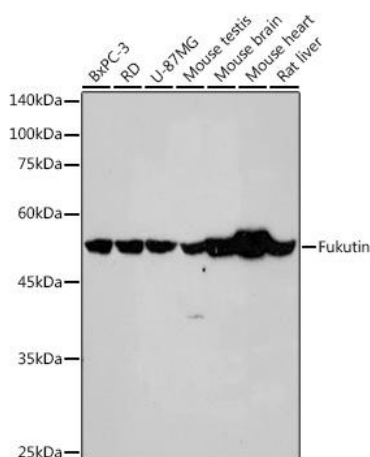

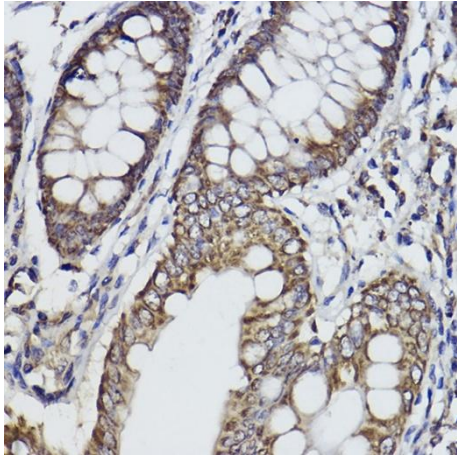

Western blot analysis of various lysates using Fukutin Rabbit mAb (CAB1385) at 1:1000 dilution. Secondary antibody: HRP-conjugated Goat anti-Rabbit IgG (H+L) (CABS014) at 1:10000 dilution. Lysates/proteins: 25µg per lane. Blocking buffer: 3% nonfat dry milk in TBST. Detection: ECL Basic Kit (AbGn00020). Exposure time: 60s.



Immunohistochemistry analysis of paraffin-embedded Human colon using Fukutin Rabbit mAb (CAB1385) at dilution of 1:100 (40x lens). High pressure antigen retrieval performed with 0.01M Citrate buffer (pH 6.0) prior to IHC staining.
