Store Bradford Reagent at Room Temperature for 1 Year.

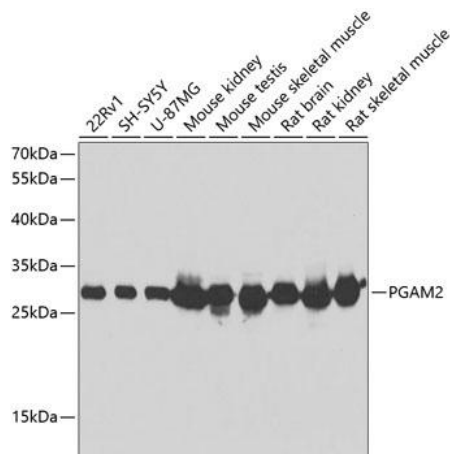

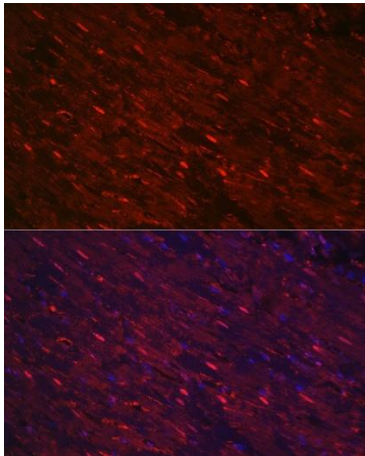

Western blot analysis of various lysates using PGAM2 Rabbit pAb (CAB7917) at 1:1000 dilution. Secondary antibody: HRP-conjugated Goat anti-Rabbit IgG (H+L) (CABS014) at 1:10000 dilution. Lysates/proteins: 25µg per lane. Blocking buffer: 3% nonfat dry milk in TBST. Detection: ECL Basic Kit (AbGn00020). Exposure time: 15s.



Immunofluorescence analysis of paraffin-embedded rat heart using PGAM2 Rabbit pAb (CAB7917) at dilution of 1:100 (40x lens). Secondary antibody: Cy3-conjugated Goat anti-Rabbit IgG (H+L) (CABS007) at 1:500 dilution. Blue: DAPI for nuclear staining.
